ATTENTION: Community Services Block Grant (CSBG) Consumer Alert

Virginians should be aware of fraudulent activity by individuals claiming to represent the Community Services Block Grant (CSBG). Fraudsters unrelated to CSBG are contacting people



by telephone, email, social media, and text message offering CSBG funding or services in exchange for a fee.

Neither the State of Virginia nor the federal government provides direct CSBG grants to individuals. Additionally, neither the Virginia Community Services Block Grant office or Office of Economic Opportunity initiates contact with individuals by phone, email, text messages, or social media channels to request personal or financial information.

Many area households above the poverty line struggle to pay bills

More than 21,000 metro Richmond households with incomes above the poverty line fell into financial stress during the first two years of the pandemic, unable to earn what it takes to cover basic bills, census data shows. That increase brought the total number of so-called "ALICE" households — Asset Limited, Income Constrained, Employed — to more than 169,000, or one-third of the metro area's total, in 2021, the latest year for which data is available. ALICE households do not earn enough to cover a basic budget for housing, child care, food, transportation, health care and a smartphone plan, plus taxes.

Poverty measures inform the work of policymakers, practitioners, and advocates to address poverty and prevent the adverse consequences associated with it. This brief summarizes basic attributes of the range of poverty measures used in the United States, as well as their strengths and limitations. Our goal is to give policy analysts and researchers the tools to appropriately interpret poverty statistics and decide when to use which measure.

Abatement Academy- Free Webinar Series on Best Use of Funds from Opioid Litigation

The Virginia Opioid Abatement Authority (OAA) and the Virginia Institute of Government (VIG) are pleased to announce the launch of the new "Abatement Academy" for 2023. The Academy is composed of a series of FREE, bi-weekly webinars to highlight examples programs that align with nationally recognized principles for the use of funds from opioid litigation. The intended audience includes local government representatives, state agency professionals, and groups or individuals who provide services or support to people suffering from opioid use disorders.

The Abatement Academy will also include one-day in-person workshops on September 7 (Abingdon) and October 19 (Charlottesville).

Future webinars will be held on the 2nd and 4th Thursday of each month starting on May 25 and ending on December 14. The sessions will be broken down based on the following nationally recognized five principles:

- Principle 1: Spend the Money to Save Lives
- Principle 2: Use Evidence to Guide Spending
- Principle 3: Invest in Youth Prevention
- Principle 4: Focus on Racial Equity
- Principle 5: Develop a Fair and Transparent Process for Deciding Where to Spend the Funding

Affordable Housing and Supportive Services Demonstration

The Administration for Children and Families (ACF), Office of Community Services (OCS) announces the availability of approximately \$2,000,000 to Community Action Agencies (CAAs) that own affordable housing units and provide wraparound supportive services to residents of the affordable units, including educational opportunities for youths and adults; afterschool and/or summer programs for children and teens; early childcare, Head Start, Early Head Start, or other early childhood education programs/opportunities for young children ages 0 to 5; older adult care services; mental health, alcohol, and addiction services; services for individuals with disabilities; self-sufficiency resources; resources on future homeownership; financial literacy training; transportation services for residents; referrals and connections to resources to help meet concrete needs; and health care services.

Mutual of America Foundation Community Partnership Award

The Mutual of America Foundation Community Partnership Award recognizes outstanding nonprofit organizations in the United States that have shown exemplary leadership by facilitating partnerships with public, private or social sector leaders who are working together as equal partners, not as donors and recipients, to build a cohesive community that serves as a model for collaborating with others for the greater good.



This year, six organizations will be selected by an independent committee to receive the Award. From this group:

- The Thomas J. Moran Award is given to the national award-winning program and includes \$100,000 and a documentary video about the program.
- The Frances R. Hesselbein Award is given to a partnership addressing social challenges in more than one community, or that demonstrates the potential to be replicated. This recipient receives \$50,000.
- · Four organizations are named Honorable Mention recipients for their programs, and each receives \$50,000.
