CSBG State Plan Update - 2nd Comment Period Now Open

There is a 2nd opportunity for agencies to review the 24-26 State CSBG Plan during the month of April. The 2nd comment period will run through April 30, 2024. This will be the final agency only comment period. There will be one additional Public Comment period that will begin in late May that will be open to a wider audience.

FY2024 Federal Appropriations Bill Finalized

The House and the Senate both cleared the final FY2024 appropriations package late last week and President Biden signed the bill into law on Saturday April 6, 2024. Some notable updates on funding that affects our network:

CSBG – \$770 million (no cuts from FY2023 levels) and 200% of FPL eligibility is included.

Eligibility: States may apply the last sentence of section 673(2) of the CSBG Act by substituting "200 percent" for "125 percent"

Head Start – \$12.272 billion (an increase of \$275 million from FY2023)

LIHEAP – \$4.025 billion (an increase of \$25 million from FY2023)

Weatherization Authorization Assistance Program - \$326 million (level funding); Training and Technical Assistance received \$10 million; Weatherization Readiness Fund received \$30 million.

Diaper Distribution Grant Demonstration - \$20 million for a continuation of the program but details on implementation decided by HHS.

ARC Seeking Applicants for No-Cost Leadership Development Program for Appalachian Community Leaders

The program, at no cost to participants, focuses on skill-building, mentoring and networking. By equipping participants with knowledge and support, ARC aims to build a stronger future for Appalachia.

The curriculum comprises six multi-day seminars across the Appalachian region, each focusing on one of ARC's investment priorities, and concludes with a graduation ceremony in Washington, D.C.
